YOUTH MONTH CELEBRATION: A DAY OF TOGETHERNESS AND HOPE



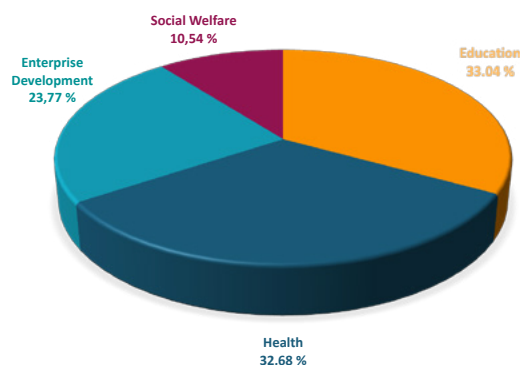

Hosted at the North West School of the Deaf, the day kicked off with a fun walk, where participants also brought along much-needed toiletries to donate to those in need. Bokamoso Solar handed over 100 dignity packs, while the Department of Social Development supplied sanitary towels for 60 learners across three local primary schools - enough to last three months.
