Youth have participated in fun, interesting and engaging and interactive sessions to discuss issues, identify problems and answer questions.

Bokomoso Solar's SMME Incubation Hub, in Kanana, launched earlier this year and proudly hosted its first workshop during August 2021. The Hub provides local entrepreneurs and SMMEs with an opportunity to receive training and gain valuable skills to help them grow and build a successful business.

Following the first workshop, which was open to all registered business owners in the community and focused on financial skills, another second workshop was held just a month later. Entrepreneurs received an introduction to sustainable building skills and how to develop a new business strategy, also known as a 'Business Model Canvas'.
